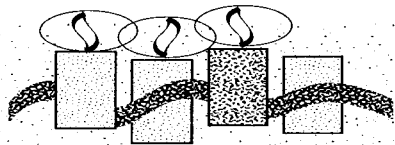


The Third Sunday of Advent

Before their ordination, to the priesthood, a group of candidates are given this food for thought: "People today are preoccupied with acquiring three C's – car, cell phone and credit card (preferably gold or platinum). But in your life and ministry as priests you must have three different C's – Christ, Cross and Celibacy. Be faithful to this three C's and you will be effective ministers of God for his people."

"What then should we do?" The people's question should be ours too. The answer of John the Baptist is very realistic and down-to-earth. He does not ask people to undertake lavish projects or build monuments. He admonishes his listeners to be honest and lead good lives. He puts emphasis on practical self-giving through sharing.

What does the answer of John the Baptist tell us? We are to be content with what is sufficient. Let there be moderation in our desires and needs, no accumulation of unnecessary material things. Let authority and power be used justly – no abuse of position, no bribery, no corruption, no cheating, no abusive treatment of people.
